

INS Introduced a Tiered Dues Structure in 2018

As a part of the 2015 INS Strategic Plan, efforts have been underway to increase the international presence of INS as a scientific and educational organization and to recognize its multinational membership. As many of you know, INS has been increasing access to special issues in related journals and new book and journal discounts. In addition, at the 2016 Boston meeting, the INS Membership Task Force was charged with generating a tiered dues structure reflecting the income diversity among the membership in various parts of the world. Based on the recommendations of the Membership Task Force at the subsequent 2016 London meeting, the Board of Governors approved a new tiered dues structure, and at the 2017 New Orleans meeting agreed to implement these changes with the rollout of the new INS Website in 2017. The changes in dues are based on the World Bank classification of Country Income Groups, which can be found at <http://chartsbin.com/view/2438>.



2018 and 2019 Tiered Dues Structure:

Discounts for Regular and Associate Members in High, Middle, Low-Middle, and Low-Income countries are based on a percentage of the dues for members in High Income Countries using World Bank Country Income classification. Adjusted amounts will be rounded to the nearest USD.

Regular Members:

1. High-Income countries: 150 USD
2. High-Middle-Income countries: 50% of Dues for High Income category
3. Low-Middle-Income/Low-Income countries: 20% of Dues for High Income category

Associate Members:

1. High-Income countries: 45 USD
2. High-Middle-Income countries: 67% of Dues for High Income category
3. Low-Middle-Income/Low-Income countries: 33% of Dues for High Income category

Emeritus Members:

1. High Income countries: 75 USD
2. High-Middle-Income countries: 40 USD
3. Low-Middle-Income/Low-Income countries: 30 USD
