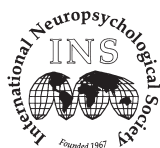

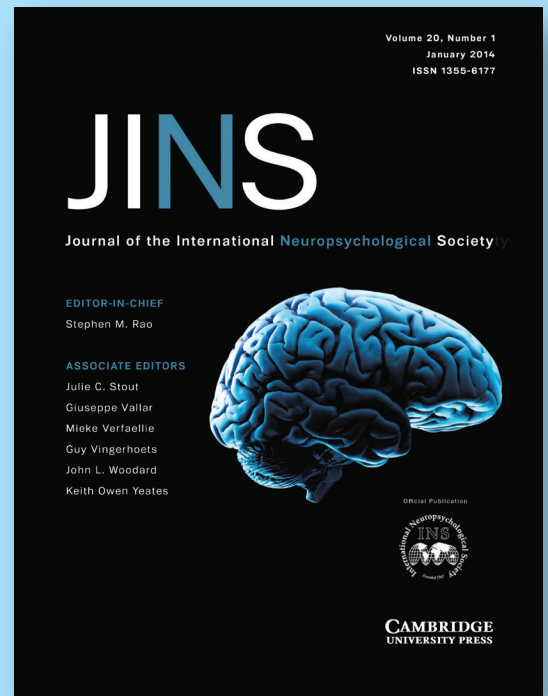

Information for Contributors

Types of papers considered:

- **Research Articles:** original, creative, high quality papers covering all areas of neuropsychology; focus may be primarily experimental, more applied or clinical
- **Brief and Rapid Communications:** shorter research articles
- **Neurobehavioral Grand Rounds:** unique case studies, which are published with an introduction by an expert in the field to provide a more global perspective
- **Critical Reviews:** reviews by experts on important topics in neuropsychology
- **Short Reviews:** conceptually-oriented snapshots of the current state of a research area by experts in that area
- **Dialogues:** a forum for publishing two distinct positions on controversial issues in a point-counterpoint form
- **Symposia:** several research articles that are thematically linked
- **Letters to the Editor:** responses to recent articles
- **Book Reviews**
